



We are looking forward to celebrating our 150th (+2) Birthday on Thursday, September 22nd at the Wyndham Resort. Tickets are on sale for \$125.00 apiece for this straight up fundraiser. I sincerely hope to greet as many of our readers as possible and tell you all about what is in store for the Newport Public Library. There are a number of holidays for which the Library closes, so please keep an eye on the website in the coming months. Notices are posted on the doors as well as all service desks at least one week in advance of these closings. The Library will be closed on Saturday, September 3rd through Monday the 5th for Labor Day and on October 10th for Columbus Day.

Have you taken note of the "library of things" yet? There are board games, puzzles, items for your inner DIY-er, tools for exploration and discovery, self-improvement, and some are for just plain fun. Do avail yourself of this collection. It has been built with the generous support of donors like you.

Lastly, but hardly least, I send my heartiest congratulations to the Friends of the Newport Public Library. For 50 years – exactly 50 years – they have been stalwart in their unstinting support of your Library. This year, with their expected annual donation to the Library, they will have raised over \$860,000.00 from book sales! Read that number again. Within five years, this will amount to \$1,000,000.00! I am stunned when I write that amount, as I have been most recently when the City of Newport declared that August 2, 2022 was "Friends of the Newport Public Library Day." It seems only fitting that the Library itself pay homage to this milestone. In addition to their annual donation, they also fund many of the entertainers and outside agencies that entertain families during Summer Reading, and most of those events are held in that room. Therefore, it was announced with great pleasure at the Board of Trustees meeting of July 21st that the lower level program room is now the Friends of the Newport Public Library Room. I can think of no better tribute than to christen the room in their honor.


Teen Programs

Teen Advisory Board



Fifty years and over \$868,000 donated to the Newport Public Library!

We are honored that the Program Room in the Library will now be named The Friends of the Newport Public Library Room. At the dedication, Library Director Joseph Logue read a Proclamation from the City of Newport declaring August 2 as Friends of the Newport Public Library Day.

The history of the Friends and the Proclamation can be viewed in the Friends bookstore. A new Friends bookmark will be revealed at the 150th Birthday party of the Newport Public Library on September 22. The new bookmark will feature a print by William Heydt; four individuals that you are likely to see often in the Library are in the painting. These bookmarks will be available in the Bookstore after September 22.

Fall is arriving and the Bookstore has great reads, classics for fall classes, beautiful children's books, and puzzles. The sale of fiction, non-fiction and DVDs continues in the lower lobby.
