

The Director's Desk - The Pro-Logue

Greetings to all our Newport friends and visitors!

In the bleak mid-winter
Frosty wind made moan
Earth stood hard as iron,
Water like a stone;
Snow had fallen, snow on snow,
Snow on snow,
In the bleak mid-winter
Long ago.

"In the Bleak Mid-Winter," by Christina Rossetti, 1830-1894

Those Pre-Raphaelites really knew how to celebrate and enjoy the season, I guess. Actually, the Newport Public Library has a full collection of Rossetti's poems, an illustrated anthology, as well as a copy of *Goblin Market: A Tale of Two Sisters*. The latter has an afterword by Joyce Carol Oates, includes illustrations by Dante Gabriel Rossetti, and decorative artwork by William Morris. Upon completion you can consider yourself well-versed and virtually steeped in this vital period of British literature, across many media.

Now, to the modern day. While my letters usually address what is happening at the Library in the coming months I want to first of all wish everyone a very Merry Christmas, Happy

Hanukah, and Happy Kwanzaa. Whichever you celebrate, or however we choose to overlap our holiday celebrations, I want to express my sincere wishes that the season brings you joy and peace. As an institution, the Library is a microcosm of the world and it is probably safe to say that the turbulence and turmoil of the last few years will not be missed if we dare to hope that we will turn a page as we enter 2023.

Have you seen the loom set up outside the Maker Lab in the runway leading into the Adult Services department? It is an interesting installation that is basically a crowd-sourced piece of art. I tried my hand at it and was generally satisfied with the work but fully engaged with the process. Not once did I have to invoke <u>Saint Anastasia of Sirmium</u>, the patron saint of weavers. I could have similarly been inspired by any of the many musical choices on offer from Ocean State Libraries by The Weavers, that sparkling combination of Lee Hays, Pete Seeger, Ronnie Gilbert, and Fred Hellerman. There are fully illustrated instructions on the frame to help you along as you work with the shuttle. I invite you to help bring this cooperative and community-based work of art-in-progress to life by signing your name on the accompanying sheet.

With the New Year comes new possibilities and the Library has a slew of programs and services to offer you. The Library offers a <u>Shakespearean roundtable</u> read-aloud as the group cycles through the plays. This is an interesting way to understand the tone and cadence of Shakespeare's texts. What befuddled many of us in high school (I, for instance, did a miserable job when I was assigned the lead role in the Scottish play) gains new insights with the group. Prefer something a bit more tangible? There is a <u>fiber arts group</u> that meets twice a month that is similarly open to all. Working on individual projects rather than the community piece mentioned above, the group is a lively and friendly association of area hobbyists.

I want to say thank you and to acknowledge the dedication that went into this year's very successful book sale organized, staffed, and produced by the Friends of the Newport Public Library. This annual event is a boon for those who wish to give great books for holiday presents or for those who are enhancing their own library. Many buyers are simply amazed by the breadth of the items on sale. I am too, and you will be. Book sales are seasonal so keep an eye out, as well as for the flag on Spring Street announcing that at the bookstore. Note that an anonymous donor has slipped mini-review cards into some of the titles on sale. Look for them, or, when making your own donation, feel free to slip in a mini-review of your own! (Please don't write **in** the book, however!)

The Youth Services is busy planning many programs to keep the young ones entertained. Please note that some of the events require registration. This allows the Library to prepare enough supplies and decide on locations. Look for the following to help beat the mid-winter blahs (because "bleaks" isn't a word). Start with Take and Make Crafts, available for pick up at the Children's desk:

- Polar Bear (January 3);
- Dragon (January 17);
- Heart Garland (January 30).

Programs for which registration is required include making:

- a <u>chef's hat and a bowl of soup</u> (January 13 at 10:00 AM) for ages 2-5;
- an <u>air-dry clay snowperson</u> (February 10 at 10:00 AM) ages 2-5;
- a woven potholder workshop (January 14) from 2:30-4:00 PM for ages 8-12;
- a paper roller coaster (January 26, at 11:00 AM); and
- wobble bots (February 16, at 11:00 AM)!

The staff of the teen area are similarly busy making sure that those visiting the Library

after school or studying from home have plenty of choices to connect with friends and remain engaged. There is the First Chapter Friday club which gets attendees off to a flying start with a new title every month. There is also a Silent Book Club where everyone reads (or studies) together in a quiet atmosphere that enhances concentration. Stop by the desk to see what Becky and Leigh have ready for you.

For those of us who use the Adult Services side of the Library there are book groups on offer, a vibrant and robust Board Game Tuesdays program, and the upcoming film series spotlighting movie favorite Robin Williams.

As Kevin says in "Home Alone," "are you thirsty for more?" If so, please visit the Library's website for news (including job opportunities!), events, services, and lists of all the amazing new items being brought into the collection weekly. Speaking of which, I just borrowed the portable steamer and a Bundt pan from our Library of Things, cutting down on ironing, but increasing baking time. Win-win, if you ask me.

Because this project requires manual dexterity, a bit of strength, and basic perseverance, is it limited to children ages 8 – 12 years old


