## **Director's Desk - The Pro-Logue**

Greetings to all our Newport friends and visitors!

Perhaps no place in any community is so totally democratic as the town library. The only entrance requirement is interest.

The Newport Public Library is proud and happy to announce that upon approval of the Library Board of Trustees **all overdue fines will be removed from items owned by the Newport Public Library**. This has been a burgeoning trend in the world of public libraries across the country and New England. Newport joins many other communities in dispensing with fines on overdue materials. The reasons are manifold. The past 18 months have exposed many procedures to closer inspection. When the Library suspended all fines during the latter two-thirds of 2020, we saw an enormous amount of items being returned. The Library – almost all Rhode Island libraries, in fact – saw a minuscule amount of items that were not returned. Upon resumption of levying fines in July 2021, there were minor fines being assessed. An astounding 97% of all Newport cardholders' accounts are in good standing. For that, I thank you.

There are practical matters to consider. Some libraries in the Ocean State Libraries consortium are still charging fines, so this change is not universal. Please be aware that the OSL network consists of **the state's public libraries** – if you return an item belonging to any library outside the network, their policies will prevail. It must be stressed that items that are lost, damaged, or billed are not included in this new policy. Patrons must still pay for items that are lost or damaged while checked out to that person's card. Note that items marked as "billed" will have that amount erased when the item is returned. Come across a Library book that is way overdue and for which you've been billed? Bring it in! Your account will be cleared.

Please be aware that the Newport Public Library has made two exceptions to going fine free: Museum Passes and Interlibrary Loans (i.e., items from non-OSL organizations). As these items are owned by other institutions, we must do all we can to ensure the timely return of the item(s) so that the Newport Public Library retains its pristine reputation as a borrower.

There is also the equalizing aspect of removing fines. They can accrue quickly and once a patron owes \$10.00 or more the ability to manage your account, to request or renew items, is suspended. There are many reasons that students and other young residents of Newport have for not being able to get to the Library to return their items in a timely fashion. Removing the onerous fine structure underscores the **Library's mission** to provide a welcoming atmosphere in which one learns, becomes inspired and engaged, and connects to the wider world.

This is a major shift in the life of your Library, and those of us who are its present custodians are excited by this milestone.

Now, to other news. You know how the Library becomes a hubbub of activity around the approaching holidays and we look forward to them with great anticipation. You may have noticed that the various animals in the Children's department have been decked out for Halloween, but decorations will also play a big part as we gear up for Thanksgiving, Christmas, and the New Year. There has been an express invitation sent to Santa Claus and it looks like the Library will be one of his early stops this year. Keep your eye on our **calendar** and we ho-ho-hope to see you there. The registration for this event begins on November 30th.

Please keep all other Library programs and services in mind: Tuesday Tips, 3D Maker Lab, crafting projects galore, the Teen Room Silent Book Club, computer workshops such as email instruction and managing Google Drive, among a plethora of other offerings.

Keep the following November dates in mind: the Library will be closed on Thursday, November 11th in honor of Veterans' Day, and on Thursday, November 25th for Thanksgiving. The Library will close at 5:00 PM on Wednesday, November 24th, for Thanksgiving Eve.

I extend my appreciation to the veterans of Newport and honor your dedication and service. Without the sacrifices you have made the Library as we know it may not presently exist. Thank you.

On behalf of the staff of the Newport Public Library, I wish you a wonderful Thanksgiving and a joyous start to the holiday season.






