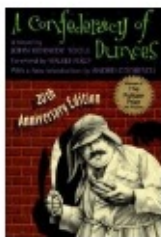

I am happy to let you know of a new service that the Library is introducing called Stack Map. If you are browsing the catalogue at home or in the Library, this service will direct you in the to its shelf location once you find it in **the catalogue**. The best part of this service is that you can be completely self-directed so that if time is short you can get your desired title from the shelf and be on your way. There is also the most valued aspect of coming to the Library: your privacy. Should you be looking for anything in the Library it is your business and yours alone. 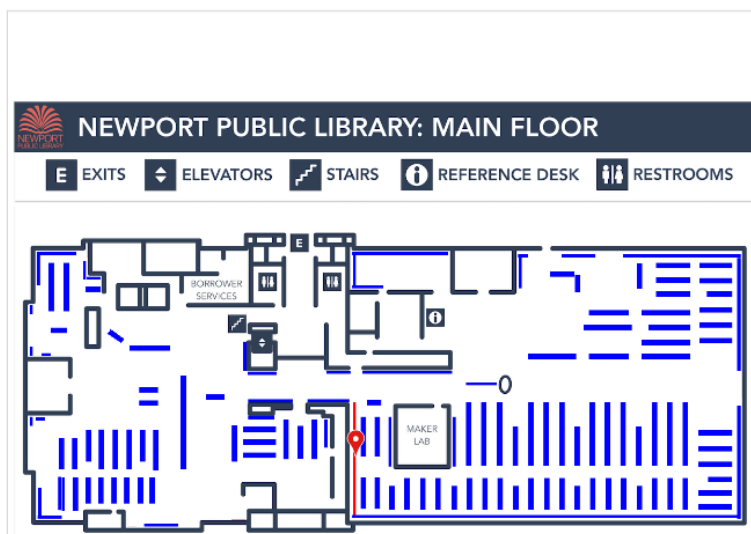

The calendar is equally packed for June as it was in May but there are many highlights I want to make particular mention of. First, following up on my previous mention of May honorees, allow me to pay equal tribute to the fathers of Newport. That third Sunday of June may see an uptick in the sale of “World’s Greatest Dad” t-shirts and coffee mugs but the sentiment is there and it is genuine. I was blessed to have wonderful parents and the two days we set aside to specifically say thank you to those who reared us are not enough. Additionally, the Library offers a great service called **ParentTV**, where you can watch videos dispensing reliable advice from the world’s leading parenting and educational experts. The recollections of all that our parents have done for is become cherished memories, even if one of those reminiscences is their usual response to our question of when children got a special day: *Every day is Kid’s Day!* In a word, True.

Following on the heels of Father’s Day the Library will take up its annual Summer Reading Program. This is an initiative in which all three departments follow a particular theme. This summer’s topic takes us out to the garden with Read Know Grow. The details will be finalized soon and we will have a web page devoted to the various activities surrounding this great program. Much of it is centered on school age youth who, studies consistently demonstrate, retain the knowledge they learned over the previous school year by continuing to read in the summer. This is a vital and vibrant program, generously funded by the Friends of the Newport Public Library, as well as from the state’s Office of Library and Information Services. I will write more about it in the July & August newsletter that will be published close to the kickoff date in late June. Wait until you see the decorations!

This newsletter is also the time that I mention the schedule changes that late spring brings. The last Sunday on which the Library will be open is Sunday, May 7th. The Library will be closed on Monday, May 29th for one of the most moving holidays, Memorial Day. Following that, Juneteenth is a "set" holiday that joins others like Independence Day and Christmas – the Library will always be closed on June 19th. Juneteenth, with the remarkable story it tells, is one of our most meaningful holidays and the Library will mark it in an appropriate and respectful manner.

Looking ahead just a bit, the Library will be shifting to its Summer Hours beginning Monday, July 3rd and going through Labor Day. Please note the minor reduction in service hours that reflect all the other magnificent entertainment options available to us all.

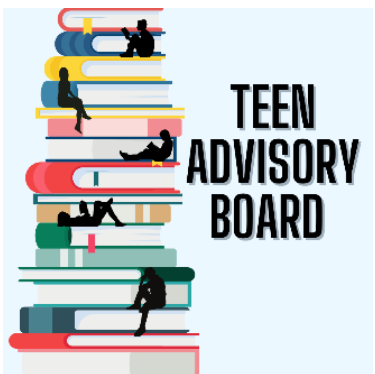

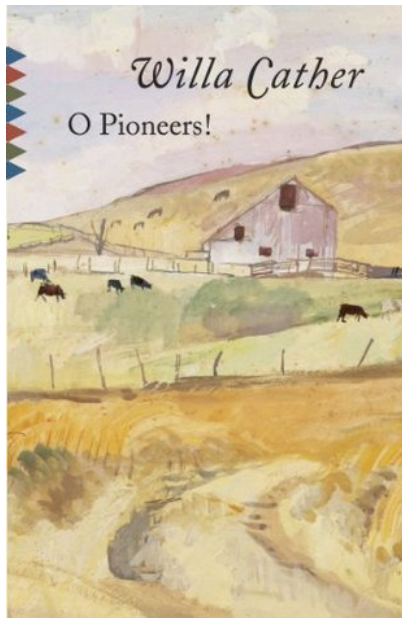

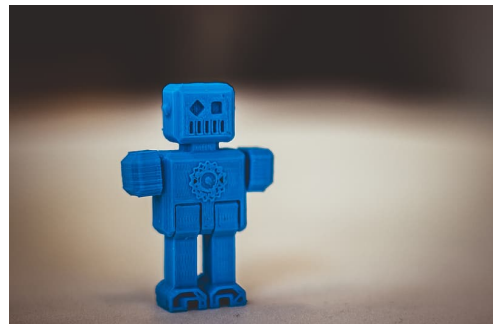
