

The Director's Desk - The Pro-Logue

No sun – no moon!

No morn – no noon –

Well I usually attempt to begin my newsletters on a cheery note, but I have loved this poem (read the full text here) since I first heard it read by the great actor Leo McKern. I don't always think of November as lacking all the gifts of nature but it is a time of transition. While July and August were a bit too wet for many of us, we were rewarded with a lovely September and October. Have you seen the leaves in Aquidneck Park? They are simply spectacular and while "carpet" might be too trite to be employed, in this case it is an entirely apt metaphor. The leaves cushion your way as you cut across the park. It has been a long time since I have seen the leaves drop so suddenly and in such numbers. Our waterlogged summer has had its reward in a spectacular autumn. Stop and admire the late afternoon sun hitting the Edward King House, setting the red brick ablaze. It is a wonderful sight.

November also heralds the beginning of "the holidays" – that busy time of year when all sorts of demands on our time make rushing about exhilarating, exhausting, and exasperating. This is a good time to remind patrons that the Library remains an oasis of calm. Come sit and catch up on titles you've been meaning to check out. I've been reading "The Bee Sting" by Paul Murray. It is a heavy undertaking and I can't possibly do it justice here as it whips back and forth in time, and stories are told by alternating narrators. As someone who is predominantly a reader of nonfiction, this book is a challenge. Isn't that, however, the fun – and reward – of reading?

To business: The staff at your Library have devoted themselves to a full slate of seasonal and holiday programming. We have approximately 120 separate and regularly scheduled programs on offer before the end of the year. A Is For Art is a wonderful way for the little ones (ages 2-5) to express themselves creatively (<u>register here</u>). I will take this opportunity once again to stress the many story times, play times, baby bookworms, and craft

programs on offer by the amazingly talented Children's librarians.

Two programs stood out for me as I was perusing the calendar. For young patrons ages 8-12 we have a Festive Potholder craft program (<u>register here</u>). With Thanksgiving around the corner home chefs will appreciate any tools that will be of service. As a child I made a potholder one summer at our local playground. I still remember how, months later, my mother using it to handle a pot full of milk for our post-skating hot chocolate.

The other program is a seminar on healthy eating. We all know and have experienced how the holidays can present real challenges to those being mindful of a healthy diet and how easy it is to give in to excess. Kathi Masi will help patrons plan and enjoy their holidays in ways that are fun, festive, and nutritious. This programs <u>requires registration</u>.

The Library now offers a Homebound Delivery service which I've mentioned before and has grown exponentially in the few months we've been able to provide it. For those of you who are homebound by any medical or physical limitation or a disability, please let us know. The full catalog of Library items is open to you. One of the other tools provided by the Library that has been on offer from the Adult Services department for quite some time remains especially popular at this time of year. The Library can transfer your old VHS tapes to a digital format. This is a unique and thoughtful gift as VCRs have more or less vanished. Have old home movies of children, relatives, gatherings, or weddings that you thought were trapped in old technology? Bring them to the Library during regular hours and our staff will convert them when you provide your own storage device (a flash drive of at least 16 GB is required). Enjoying revived memories is a wonderful way to spend time with family and friends.

And speaking of friends – or in this case, Friends with a capital F – the Library received its annual donation of \$25,000 in September. This gift is made possible by the dedicated team of volunteers who labor throughout the year to receive, clean up, prepare, stock, and sell gently used donations by the residents of Newport. Their hard work pays dividends throughout the year as they sponsor many programs during the Summer Reading initiative. I thank and honor the Friends for their ceaseless work either in the back of the house or the front of the house.

Along with the holidays comes some slight alterations to the Library schedule. The staff endeavors mightily to provide all sorts of entertainments during this time of year and does so knowing that they too can partake of the pleasures of the season. November and December dates to keep in mind:

November 7: Election Day and the Library will be open as we are also serving as a polling place! Get out and vote!

November 11: The Library will be closed for Veterans' Day.

November 22: Closing early at 5:00 PM.

November 23: Closed for Thanksgiving.

December 24-26: Closed for Christmas. The Library will open at 9:00 AM on Wednesday, December 27th.

December 31-January 1: Closed for the New Year holiday. The Library will reopen at 9:00 AM on Tuesday, January 2nd.

The Library is now open on Sunday from 1:00-5:00 PM. There are Sundays that the Library will be closed, so please note the dates of November 12, the above holiday dates, the

Sunday before MLK Day and Presidents' Day (that is, January 14th and February 18th), March 17th, and March 31th (Easter Sunday). The last Sunday the Library is open on May 5, 2024.

I hope you take away a sense that the Library is here for you and that the staff is always on the lookout for stimulating programs and innovative services. I send this with my sincere best wishes for a holiday season filled with happiness, good health, and much joy!




