



The Director's Desk - The Pro-Logue

Greetings to all our Newport friends and visitors!

[The Junto] was the mother of all the North American subscription libraries, now so numerous. It is become a great thing itself, and continually increasing. These libraries have improved the general conversation of the Americans, made the common tradesmen and farmers as intelligent as most gentlemen from other countries, and perhaps have contributed in some degree to the stand so generally made throughout the colonies in defense of their privileges...

I recently came across a photo that was taken when I attended the Public Library Association (2018) meeting in Philadelphia. At one particular session there was an actor who – rather impressively – portrayed Mr. Franklin. He is usually portrayed as rascally and wily old Ben, but this undervalues his achievements both in the cause of liberty and intellectual freedom. We should all of us be continually appreciative of such noble goals. His presence in the American consciousness is remarkable.

The original reference to the PLA meeting is due to the fact that I just returned from another conference, that of the New England Library Association in Portland, ME. I would

like to thank the Library's Board of Trustees who continually encourage career and professional growth, and to the Friends of the Newport Public Library who generously offer to underwrite the expense of staff members who wish to attend annual conferences.

I am pleased to announce that the biggest takeaway from the conference, however, is that Newport will be the host city of the NELA 2025 conference. This will be a wonderful chance to showcase our spectacular City by the Sea to those librarians from the woods of Maine, to the suburbs of New York City, from the White Mountains to our own silver shores. I'll keep you posted about developments and decisions, but I can assure you that this decision makes me professionally and personally proud.

To the present day: just yesterday there was a meeting with curators from the Naval War College Museum. They recently unearthed a 100-year-old time capsule that was buried on its front lawn. It was placed there in 1924 as part of a ceremony to observe the 285th anniversary of the founding of Newport. The commanding officer of the base at that time, Captain Franck Evans, invited several local officials to participate, and together they placed a variety of items in the capsule that represented both the Navy and the City of Newport. (By the way, many thanks to Rob for the preceding information about the capsule!)

The Museum will be transporting the capsule soon where it will be on display in the Library in its intact state. In the next year the capsule will be opened, examined, cataloged, and its contents preserved according to archiving best practices. Once that work is complete, the contents will be displayed once again in the Library for all to enjoy. Keep an eye on the website for news!

I am extending a call to all of our readers that the Library is refurbishing its collection of photographs of veterans for its November display in the Spring Street Lobby. Annette, a former staff member, curated this wall assiduously during her service with the Library. Working with some Friends volunteers, we will ensure that much of the material Annette collected will be refreshed and displayed. If you are interested in doing so, I kindly ask that you bring photos (one photo of each veteran please) of loved ones who have served our country in war and peace. Short biographical sketches are welcome as well. This will be a dynamic display that will be enhanced with each photo you bring in through November 8th. We will make copies of the photo you bring in. The Library cannot accept originals nor can we guarantee continued display in future exhibitions.

With Veterans Day coming, this will also be a timely reminder of the holiday calendar for the Library. With the December holidays falling in the middle of the week, I urge you be aware of our closing dates and times. Naturally, there will be a copious amount of programming for children around the holidays, so please continue to consult the <u>Library's website</u> and its <u>event calendar</u> for the full slate of services being offered.


